### IP3 Executive Officer joins Fortune 500 CIOs in China

Roger Hart, Executive Officer of IP3 was recently invited to join the CIOs from several Fortune 500 companies on a trip to China. The participating CIOs included those from Air France/KLM, Alcatel-Lucent, Daimler, Lufthansa, TOTAL, Eni and many more. The trip focused on showcasing China's spectacular growth in world-class IT services and the participants attended conferences and industry site visits in Beijing, Shanghai, and Wuhan over six intensive days.

The CIOs were clearly impressed by many of the things that the Chinese are doing. "We are talking about *Cloud Computing*," said one of the European CIOs, "But the Chinese are already doing it." The same is true in other areas, such as the *Internet of Things* where the State Grid has already started to roll out smart appliances to one billion customers. The scale at which the Chinese are doing things also impressed the visitors. Wuhan, 1,000 km south of Beijing and 1000 km east of Shanghai, is reinventing itself from a former heavy industry player into Wuhan Optics Valley with a million university students.

"There are huge opportunities for IP3 in China", said Hart. "Their Senior Management is impressive with many having held similar positions in the U.S., Hong Kong, and Taipei. Their entry-level talent pool is also huge, with 500,000 students in Shanghai alone taking their college entrance exams this year. But where IP3 can really help is in accrediting professional programs at the upper end of mid-management; those already working at or planning to work at a SFIA Level 5 Responsibility and Accountability Level. The IP3 approach is scalable to such large numbers, especially if aligned with a Trusted Source, but a partnership

with government and industry is critical. This is especially true in China, but is probably the same in other countries that do not have a long history of societies promoting professionalism in IT. I really look forward to helping make IP3 happen on a large scale in China.”

## ***Converging Technologies: Body, Brain and Being***

Conference held in Maribor, Slovenia

The omnipresence of converging technologies influences the way of life of individuals, communities, and societies. On the one hand it can be inspiring. On the other hand, worrying.

On the 17th and 18th of May 2010, the Institute of Information Science in Maribor (Slovenia) hosted the conference, conceived by IFIP WG 9.2, with the inspirational title: "Converging Technologies: Body, Brain, and Being".

Jozsef Gyoerkoes, state secretary at the Slovenian Ministry of Higher Education, Science and Technology, opened the event. Donald Gotterbarn, professor emeritus from East Tennessee State University, was a special guest of the Slovene Society Informatika. Don's key note speech on May 17<sup>th</sup> 2010 linked the conference theme to that of the World Information Society Day, which was launched by the United Nations in 2006. On the following day, thought leader, Gunilla Bradley, professor emerita from KISTA in Sweden, contemplated the psychological and organisational aspects of technological convergence.

There are increasing demands for a more integrated research into the convergence phenomenon which is beginning to define our future. IFIP's "Social accountability and computing" working group is heavily involved in both public and research discussions about the challenges which emerge from micro-nano-bio technologies. At the conference, the different aspects of the influence of converging technologies were dealt with by twenty papers from both social and ethical viewpoints. In a specially focused debate on young person's views on these developments, the conference attendees were joined by the students of the University of Maribor and its "online faculty" called DOBA <http://www.eng.doba.si/>. The two days of intense discussions attracted over one hundred attendees.

Marc van Lieshout, one of WG9.2's two vice-Chairs, and a speaker at the conference highlighted: "Transhumanists take an extreme position in the debate about enhancement technologies. They argue that human beings will be overtaken by technology, and that humans should be allowed to use whatever technology they choose to improve their own physical or mental conditions. This point of view can be questioned on several grounds. It can be scientifically disputed and ethically challenged ... Computer scientists need to be aware of these initiatives, and the role of ICT in these developments."

Penny Duquenoy (Conference Chair, Diane Whitehouse (Chair, WG 9.2) and Franci Pivec (Organizing Committee) received praise for a well-thought out and well-executed conference that the Icelandic volcano might have shaken up a little but could not endanger.

## ***International IFIP Working conference on Enterprise Interoperability (IWEI 2011)***

“Interoperability and Future Internet for next-generation enterprises”

March 23-24, 2011, in Stockholm, Sweden

This working conference aims at identifying and discussing challenges and solutions with respect to Enterprise Interoperability (EI), both at the scientific and the technical level, with a special focus on the use of Future Internet technology in the context of EI.

One of the characteristics of our economy today is that enterprises increasingly (need to) compete and collaborate in a global market, using the internet and other technical means to overcome the traditional barrier of geographical distribution. Another characteristic is continuous and rapid change, which may be internal or external to individual enterprises, but anyway affecting the way these enterprises can perform in relation to other enterprises and their market environment. The success of an enterprise therefore more and more depends on its ability to seamlessly interoperate with other enterprises, and be able to adapt to changes, instead of making some product or providing some service in the most efficient way.

The role of the current internet for EI is essential but at the same time very limited in the light of its potential. The Future Internet should be much more than a universal access and communication infrastructure. It should be able to empower enterprises to create new business value in competition and together with other enterprises, based on relevant knowledge about each other and the market. It should do so while making efficient use of physical resources and having a minimal environmental footprint. The current internet should evolve in a universal business support system in which enterprises enjoy interoperability services that can be invoked on the fly according to their business needs.

The working conference will be hosted by KTH, the Royal Institute of Technology, in Stockholm, Sweden. Built across 14 islands and with one third of the city area covered with water, Stockholm is also known as the Venice of the North. Stockholm is a modern city, with a varied skyline shimmering in the clear and clean waters. At the same time, it has a rich history, with roots well preserved within the Old Town area.

## ***“Privacy and Identity Management for Life”: Summer school held in Helsingborg, Sweden***

With emerging Internet and Web-based applications, our societies are facing ever more questions about how to manage people's privacy and identity throughout their lifetimes. This challenging topic can be faced through a wide variety of solutions which range from the technical to the legal, social, and ethical.

This was the focus of the sixth international summer school to be organised jointly by a number of IFIP TC9 and TC11 working groups. Working groups 9.2., 9.6/11.7, 11.4 and 11.6, and the EU FP7 project, PrimeLife, to hold a five-day summer school. One stream within the Summer School was arranged by the EU FP7 project ETICA. It took place in Helsingborg, Sweden between the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> August 2010 in Jakob Hansens Hus, a local museum and meeting place. This is the sixth in a series of summer schools which originated back in 1991 with the first IFIP-sponsored summer school held by IFIP WG9.2.

“Emerging Internet Applications, such as Web 2.0 applications and cloud computing, increasingly pose privacy dilemmas. People who use the Internet leave trails of personal data which may be stored for many years to come. It has become hard for individuals to manage and control the release and use of information that concerns them. What are the most effective ways to handle this management of privacy and identity?” was the opening challenge of the summer school, launched by Dr Simone Fischer-Hübner of Karlstad University, a founding member of IFIP's WG9.6/11.7.

Over 75 master and PhD students from throughout the globe associated with leading thinkers and policy-makers to share thoughts and directions about this huge international challenge. Attendees came from 17 countries, some of whom were local to Sweden and others who came from as far afield as Ireland, Canada and the US. The accompanying photo shows some 40 of the people attending the school at an evening outing to the Kronborg Castle (“Hamlet's Castle”) in Helsingør, Denmark.

Young researcher and student papers were presented in a series of interactive workshops. Michael Dowd of the University of Salford, UK, who is a participant in the VOME project was awarded with having written and presented the best student paper. His research is on the online privacy attitudes of 16-24 year olds. Other attendees were interested in the privacy rights of vulnerable people and of older adults.

Thought leadership input was given from a wide range of industrialists, academics, and policy-makers. Outstanding keynotes were offered from representatives of the German Ministry of the Interior and the US White House. Companies such as Google, Intel, and IBM Research were represented. Academics from leading institutions such as TU Graz (Austria), Goethe University Frankfurt and TU Dresden (Germany), Tilburg University (Netherlands), the Royal Institute of Technology (Sweden), De Montfort University (UK), and Brown and Carnegie Mellon Universities (US) all participated with inspiring input.

The school attendees are eager that their ideas be considered with some seriousness by policy-makers and researchers. Resolving the questions posed at the summer school's has to be one of the major, ongoing challenges of the second decade of the 21<sup>st</sup> century.
